Personally appeared before me William Smith Esquire one of his Majesty's Council for the Province of New York Garret Van Helder a Subscribing Witness to the within written Instrument, who being duly sworn saith that he saw the within named Thomas Lewis, Louwerens Van Kleeck, Yaephie Van Kleeck, Isaac Kip, Cornelea Kip, Geeste Roberts, Abraham Freer, Johanna Freer, Johannes Lewis, Francis Filkin, Catharena Filkin, and Barendt Lewis Seal and deliver the same Instrument of Writing as their several Voluntary Acts and Deeds for the Uses therein mentioned, and that the Name of John Van Helder signed as a Witness thereto is the Hand Writing of John Van Helder and was signed in the Presence of this Deponent. And I having perused the same and finding no Vrayure, Interclination or Obliteration therein do allow that it be recorded.

This Indenture made this Twenty second Day of May in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven Hundred and seventy two, Between Antje Waldron and David Waldron both of Harlem in the But Ward of the City of New York in the Province of New York two of the Executors of the last Will & Testament of William Waldron late of Harlem aforesaid of the one part, and Dirch Lefferts of the City of New York aforesaid Merchant of the other part Whereas the said William Waldron deceased by his last Will and Testament bearing Date the Twenty second Day of August in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven Hundred and sixty two among other Things did give full Power and absolute Authority to his Executors to sell by one or more Sales in a convenient Time after his Decease as much Land or part of his Farm as they or the Major Part of them should judge best, and the Conveyance or Conveyances so to be made by his Executors should be good and effectual both in Law and Equity, as by the said last Will and Testament (Record thereof remaining in the Secretary's Office in the City of New York) Reference being thereunto had may more fully and at large appear. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Antje Waldron and David Waldron by Virtue of the Authority to them given by the said last Will and Testament of the said William Waldron deceased, and for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and sixty one Pounds four Shillings current lawfull Money of New York aforesaid to them the said Antje Waldron & David Waldron in Hand paid, at or before the Insealing and Delivery of these Presents the Receipt whereof they the said Antje Waldron and David Waldron do hereby acknowledge, and thereof and therefrom and of and from every Part and parcel thereof do acquit, release, exonerate, and for ever Discharge the said Dirch Lefferts his Heirs, Executors and Administrators,

Be it Remembered, that on the Sixteenth day of April 1774, personally appeared before me William Smith Esquire one of his Majesty's Council for the Province of New York, Garet Van Gelder who being duly sworn saith, That John Van Gelder whose name is subscribed to a Memorandum at the Head of this Partition was this Deponent's Father, who is long since dead, that this Deponent is well acquainted with his said Father's handwriting, having often seen him write, and that the name of his Father subscribed under the said Memorandum is of his said Father's Hand Writing, and I having perused the same and finding no Interlineation (except the word N^o 56468 between the second and third line in the Memorandum) nor any obliteration except the word &c on the third line and the word Isaac on the eighth line of the same Memorandum, nor any Erasure; do allow that this Instrument be recorded.
