

COUNTESS BEATRICE WEDS.

Daughter of Count and Countess E. von Bylandt Married to J. D. Nichols.

The wedding of John Donaldson Nichols of Boston, a son of the Rev. Dr. Harry P. Nichols, rector of Holy Trinity Church, and the Countess Beatrice, a daughter of the Count and Countess E. von Bylandt of The Hague, Holland, took place yesterday at the rectory of the church, 18 West 122d Street, in the presence of a few friends at noon. The Rev. Mr. Peck officiated, and the Rev. Dr. Nichols, the father of the bridegroom, gave the bride in marriage.

She wore an afternoon gown of pale gray marquisette and silver, and carried white chrysanthemums, and her maid of honor, her sister, the Countess Eugenie von Bylandt, wore a white and silver frock trimmed with black fur, and carried yellow chrysanthemums, the von Bylandt colors being black and yellow.

Mr. Nichols had his brother, Shepley Nichols, as his best man. The rectory was decorated with yellow and white chrysanthemums. Mr. Nichols and his bride have gone to Groton, Mass., where they will spend a few days, and later they will go to Intervale, the country home of Mr. Nichols's parents in the White Mountains before going to Boston, where Mr. Nichols went into business soon after his graduation in 1906 from Harvard and where they will live.

Mr. Nichols and his bride first met on board the Ryndam, when she sailed from this port on July 4 last, the Countess having been visiting friends here. The Rev. Mr. Peck, who officiated at the wedding, was also on board. Later the couple met in Paris, and while there the engagement occurred. About three weeks ago the Countess and her sister came over, and were the guests of the Rev. Dr. Nichols and Mrs. Nichols until the wedding took place.
