PRELUDE: (RC attached sheet containing the following)

(As the Pascal Candle, symbol of the Light of Christ, is carried into the church, the congregation stands and the following anthems are said by the Officiant:)

I am Resurrection and I am Life, says the Lord. Whoever has faith in me shall have life, even though he die. And everyone who has life, and has committed himself to me in faith, shall not die for ever. As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awakening, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger. For none of us has life in himself, and one becomes his own master when he dies. For if we have life, we are alive in the Lord, and if we die, we die in the Lord. So, then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's possession. Happy from now on are those who die in the Lord! So it is, says the Spirit, for they rest from their labors.

Minister: The Lord be with you People: And also with you.

Let us pray.

Oh God, who by the glorious resurrection of your son Jesus Christ destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light: Grant that your servant Robin, being raised with him, may know the strength of his presence, and rejoice in his

eternal glory; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

(Omit the prayer for grieving family) The people sit.

(Omit Liturgy of the Word.)

Psalm 122 in unison (not Psalm 23)

122 I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord.

Philippians 4: 4-8 (only)

² Our feet shall stand within thy gates, O Jerusalem.

⁴ Whither the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, unto the testimony of Israel, to give thanks unto the name of the Lord.

⁷ Peace be within thy walls, and prosperity within thy palaces.

- ²⁴ For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?
- ²⁵ But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it.
- ²⁶ Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
- ²⁷ And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.
- ²⁸ And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

- ³⁶ As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.
- ³⁷ Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.
- ³⁸ For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,
- ³⁹ Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
